The entire issue is taken up with our Neighbourhood Development Plan -- or NDP -- which, as I'm sure most of you are aware, is a policy document, demanded by the government, that, in tandem with Herefordshire's recently (2015) adopted Core Strategy, will shape our parish environment from the time it's accepted by you, the Cradley and Storridge community at large, until 2031 and beyond.

If we, the Parish Council and its NDP group, have got it right -- and we honestly believe we have -- the Plan will be a mighty bulwark against the predations of the modern developer.

Inside this issue is a consultation form which should be sent back to the address shown.

Two things I would urge:

- Read the finished document once it has been published on Cradley PC's website, or hard copies to be found in both Village Halls (Cradley and Storridge)
- Vote FOR our -- your! -- NDP at the Referendum that will follow later this year.

REMEMBER -- so much more, in community terms, can be achieved once the NDP has been adopted.

The Cradley Neighbourhood Development Plan group was tasked by the Parish Council with producing, for the community, a plan to take the Parish through to 2031. The group is made up of a mixture of parish councillors and interested parishioners.

They have worked exhaustively from those early days to arrive at where we are today, ready to present the plan to the community for consultation.

The Plan is necessary for the community to fulfill its needs and aspirations within government and local authority strategies. Whilst the Localism Bill aspires to give communities greater say and control over their position in this structure total local control is a long way off.

Whilst the NDP does go a long way to enable us to decide what we will and will not accept in our parish. We are unable to do such things as put a total ban on building houses in our area.



What we can do, through the NDP, is define where we want - and don't want - such developments.

Cradley Parish Neighbourhood Development Plan (in a nutshell)

- is the key protection policy framework designed to deliver desired development in the Parish over the next 15 years
- is formed from the Parish Council undertaking extensive consultation and public engagement over the past 5 years
- is formed from consideration of over 40 options in the formulation of the policies
- is referred to by planners when considering planning applications
- is a framework within which the community can develop their plans without weakening or compromising the policies of the NDP
- gives better protection from developers who wish to challenge planning requirements
- decides where the settlement boundary should be reinstated
- is not intended, or required, to be the vehicle to deliver individual projects, but provide the framework within which they are delivered.
- is compliant with Herefordshire's 'Core Strategy'
- does not remove the right to apply for planning permission
- supports the development of community facilities
